COMMENTS

This meeting was called to order at 12:00pm. Present were Chairman Sidney Baines, Commissioner Richard Bairam and Assistant Superintendent John Clark. Superintendent Ken Conaty was excused from this meeting. Commissioner Robert Duhaime did not show up to this meeting.

Approve and Sign manifest

Commissioner Richard Bairam made motion to approve the 2023 billing warrant and the 2022 warrant for the tax collector. Chairman Sidney Baines seconded. All in favor, the motion was carried unanimously.

Approve Minutes: Commissioner Richard Bairam made motion to approve both the workshop and meeting minutes from December 20, 2022. Chairman Sidney Baines seconded. All in favor, the motion was carried unanimously.

Read Correspondence

Financial Report: Guy came in to give the sewer commission a quick overview of the Hooksett Sewer Commission accounts.

- Commissioner Richard Bairam made motion to transfer \$103,301.10 from the HSC Plant and Composting account to the HSC checking account. For the Martin's Ferry Pump station (\$67,825.21) and Tri-town sewer pump station (\$35,475.89) expenditures through December 2022. Chairman Sidney Baines seconded. All in favor, the motion was carried unanimously.
- Commissioner Richard Bairam made motion to transfer \$418,764.01 from the HSC Plant and composting account to the HSC checking account for PRB Construction payment request #10.
 Chairman Sidney Baines seconded. All in favor, the motion was carried unanimously.
- Commissioner Richard Bairam made motion to transfer \$17,655.72 from the HSC Capital Reserve account to the HSC checking account for capital expenditures through December 2022 above the \$132,800 budget. Chairman Sidney Baines seconded. All in favor, the motion was carried unanimously.

Scheduled Appointments: None

Assistant Superintendent Clark's Report:

Plant:

- Plant is currently running on one IFAST train right now, less foam, high flow from rain event
- Rooftop heating/ac unit issues. Currently waiting on a price to have it replaced

- There was a power failure at the Plant Friday December 23, 2022 for 4.5 hours
- There was a power failure in the evening (around 11pm) at Martin's Ferry pump station on December 23, 2022. Power was finally restored on December 25, 2022 at 3pm.
- A pole and three transformers were lost in the yard next to the plant (Assistant Superintendent John Clark shared a picture he had with the Sewer Commission)
- A flow meter shorted out in a surge- the replacement controller cost \$4500.00. Commissioner
 Richard Bairam asked if the current meter was still working. Assistant Superintendent John Clark
 said it works intermittently. The pump station itself it working, the meter was affected by the
 power surge. The replacement is slated to take 20 days to come in.

TIF Project:

Still waiting on the Tri Town easement to be signed. Superintendent Conaty reached out to the
owner on December 27th and was promised it would be signed and sent out that day. Linda
O'Keefe the office manager reached out to Bruce Thomas at the town hall (today) to see if he
has received anything and he has not.

Phase 3A Plant Upgrades:

- · Underground/above ground air piping is continuing
- Two yard hydrants have been installed
- · Catch basin is installed
- New splitter box poured gates are installed
- Sparge air blowers and pipe work continues
- Started new 24" pipe to grit chamber
- Next Construction meeting is today January 3rd at 1:00pm.
- Up charges: Basement sump pump/rear bathroom drain

Solar:

- Assistant Superintendent John Clark handed out an updated solar sheet to the Sewer Commissioners (Attachment 1).
- Eversource Kwh rates are at the highest ever \$0.29/Kwh at the beginning of the year it was \$0.08/Kwh.
