This meeting was called to order at 12:04pm. Present were Chairman Sidney Baines, Commissioner Richard Bairam, Commissioner Robert Duhaime, Superintendent Ken Conaty and Assistant Superintendent John Clark.

Approve and Sign Manifest

Approve meeting Minutes: Commissioner Richard Bairam made motion to approve the workshop and regular meeting minutes from May 7, 2024. Commissioner Robert Duhaime seconded. All in favor, the motion was carried unanimously.

Scheduled Appointments: There were no scheduled appointments

Superintendent Conaty's Report:

Plant:

- Plant numbers are good. TSS is down to 14.2 from 16.7 to 14.2. BOD is down to 9.5 from 10.5.
- pH was riding around 6.62 after adjustments 7.03
- Still cleaning the Sewer Commission office basement
- Webinar on EPA permitting process scheduled for June 3rd at 11:00am

- Chairman Sidney Baines asked how long the General Permit lasts.
 Superintendent Conaty responded with 6 years.

Chairman Sidney Baines as how PFAS is being addressed in Sewer.
 Superintendent Conaty responded with "Nothing, all we are told to do at this point is monitor it."

Solar:

- Solar production looks good. Assistant Superintendent John Clark passed out the solar spreadsheet (attachment 2) and went over it with the Sewer Commission
- Discussion was had as to how the rate of electricity affects the overall savings from solar.

Phase 3A Plant Upgrade:

- Final balance sheet for the project is done. Total came in \$50,000 under budget.
- The releasing of held funds and the final payment will happen at the end of the month

Force Main Replacement/Martin's Ferry pump station upgrades:

- Superintendent Conaty met with Eversources' attorney at his office in regards to the easement. Some very minor changes are being made, just waiting on Eversource.
- Superintendent Conaty met with Andre about the town easements. They have been approved.
- The 2 easements needed from SNHU have been approved
- A draft of the easement needed was sent to Old Castle
- A letter was sent to McClellan, Superintendent Conaty thinks a registered letter needs to be sent out.
- Other than McClellan all easements just need to be signed.

Dewatering Project:

- Screw presses are to be delivered by the end of December
- Final measurement for conveyers will be done tomorrow

Asset Management:

- · Continuing to enter new equipment
- Will continue to scan documents through the summer

TIF Project:

- TRI-Town pump station is still under construction
- The electrician started
- HVAC was started
- The final road paving will happen on Friday
- Hydro seeding is being done tomorrow
- Driveway paving will be done on June 17th
- The new Generator was shipped yesterday

Other:

- Construction continues at 7 Martin's Ferry Road
- The Commercial portion of Park Place will be starting soon
- 96 Peterbuilt on auction. The auction ends May 31st and the current bid is at \$20,700.00.
- Re-graveling of Egawes Drive easement will happen this week
- There will be a TIF meeting June 3rd
- Merrimack St. pump station panels shipped last Friday. The pumps ordered for Golden Gate arrived in February.

Old Business:

- TIF updates are every third Tuesday of the month
- Bruce Thomas was unable to attend the Sewer Commission meeting but send in a report to Superintendent Conaty.

- Final paving/completion of pump station is happening soon
- Martin's Ferry road with culvert relocation was still gathering letters of support.
- Multiple TIF projects are still in the running for funding
- \$880,000 of TIF funds are available for use

This General Permit is an effort to streamline the efficiency of the permitting process and to ensure consistency for all similar dischargers. The requirements under this General Permit are designed to match the requirements that would be in an individual permit reissuance for each facility.
